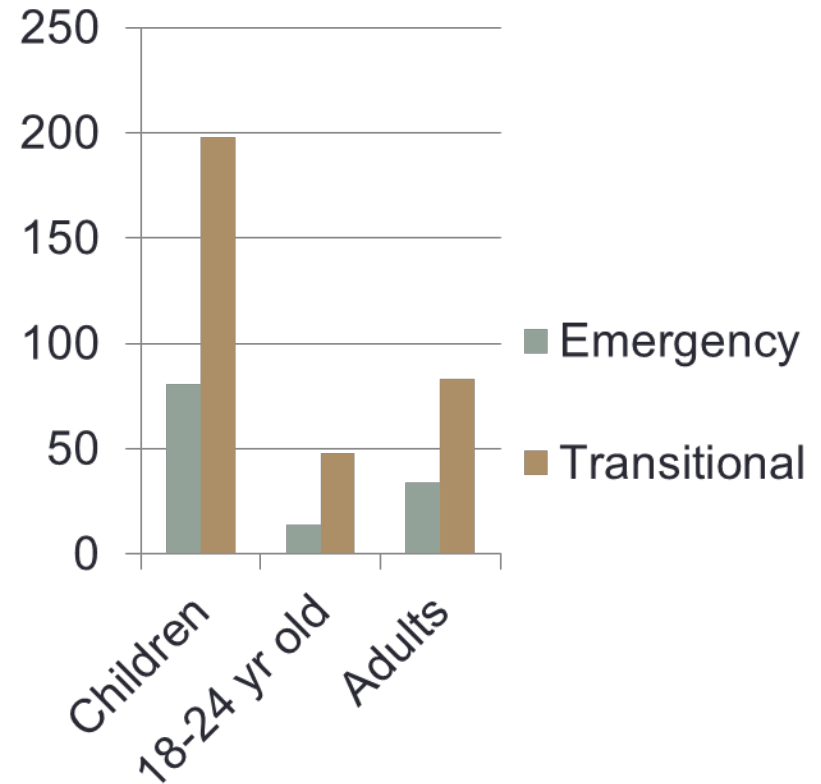

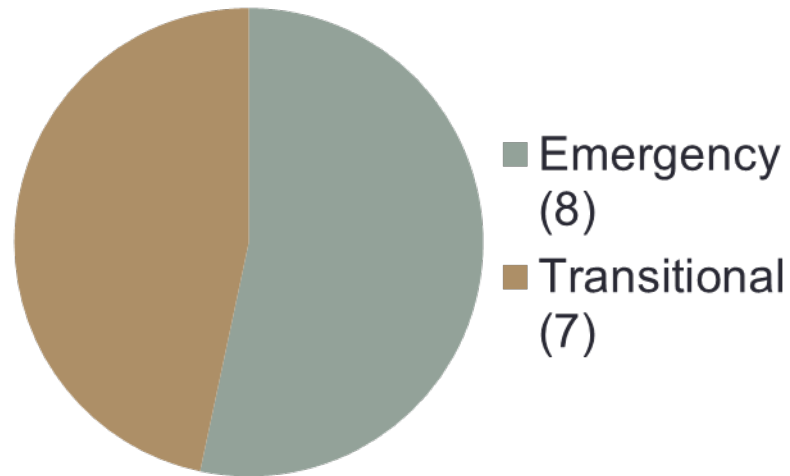

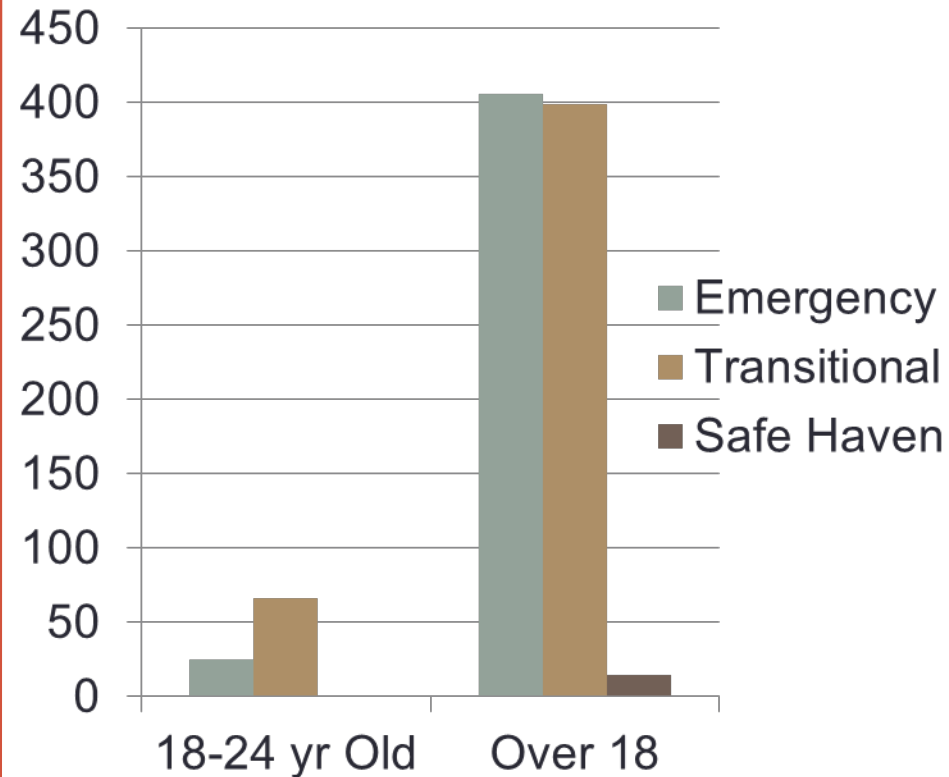
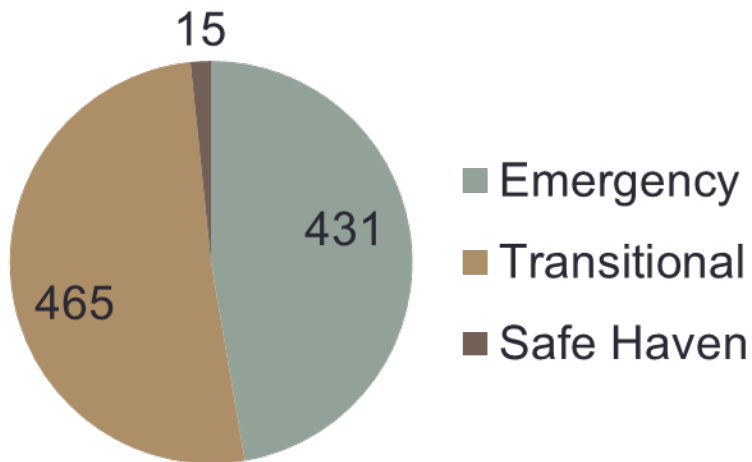

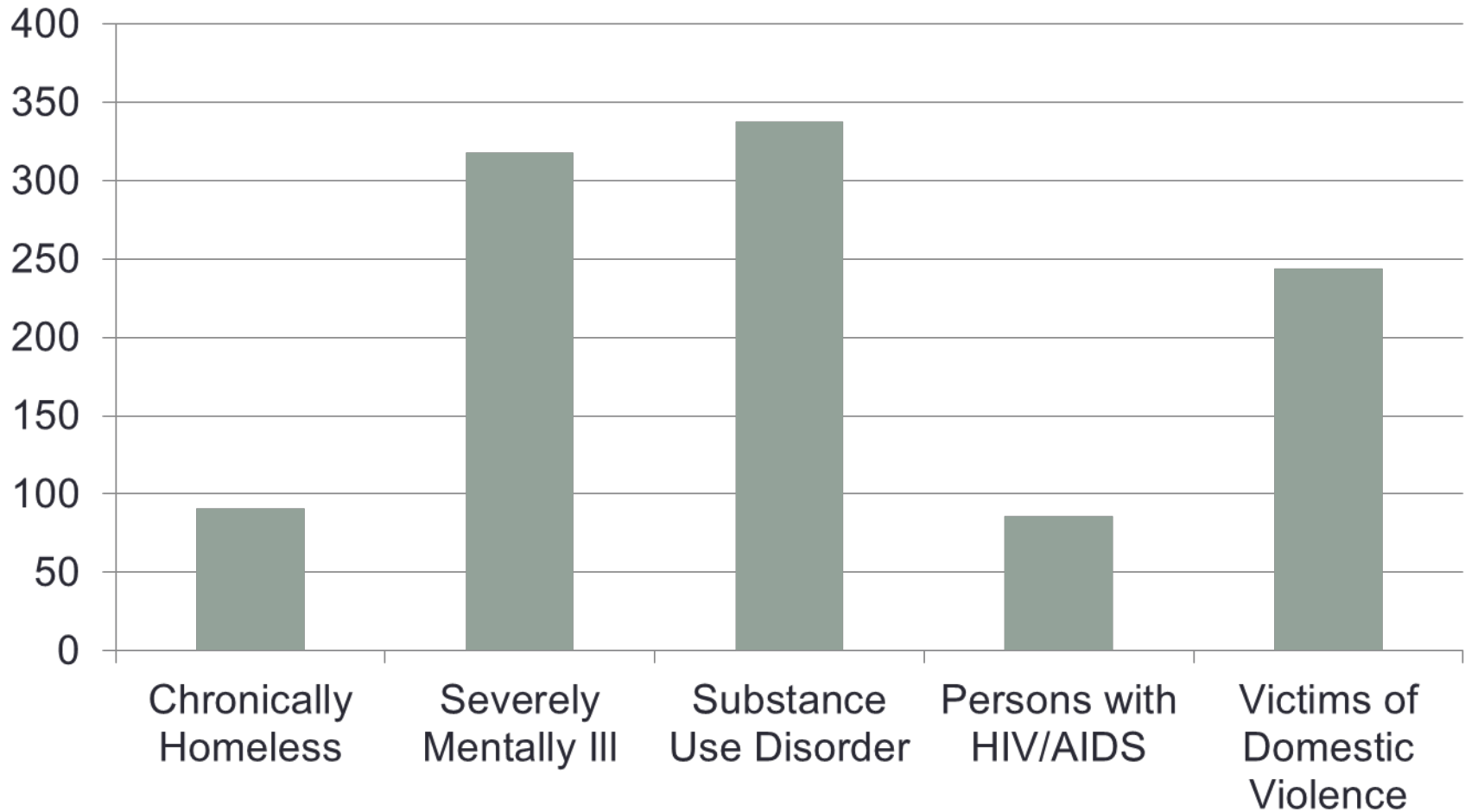

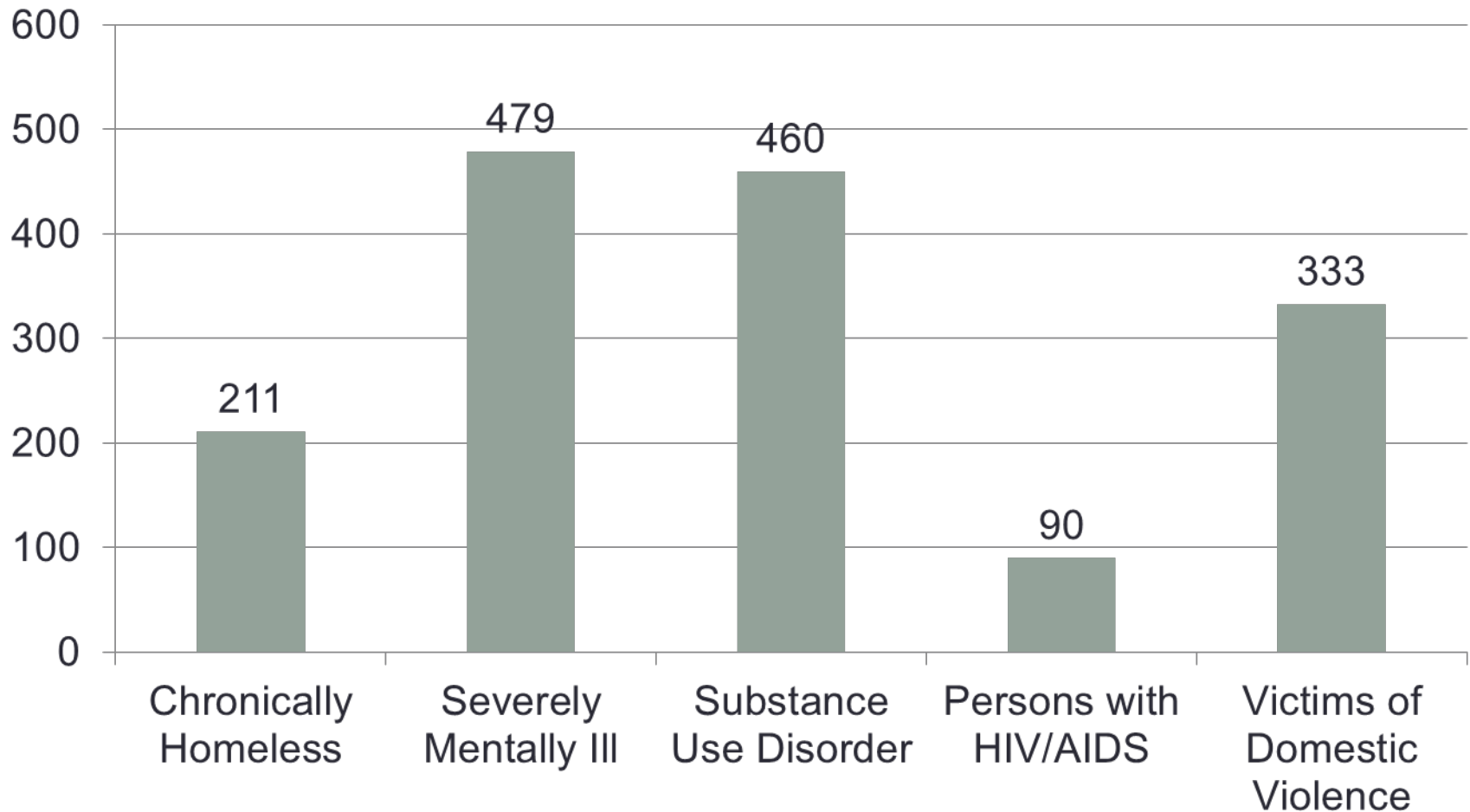

## Subpopulations of all persons

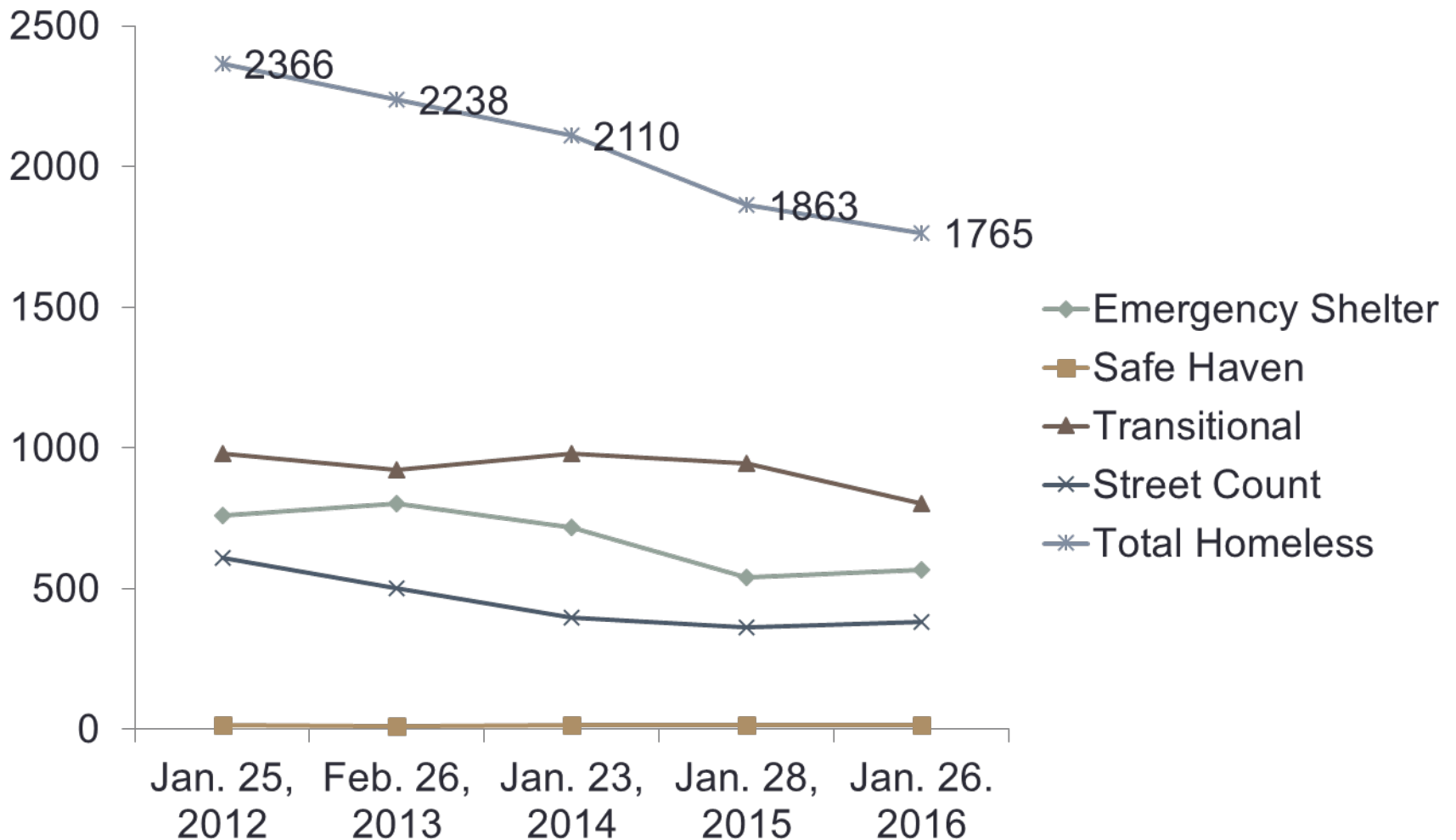


# Combined PIT Data 2016

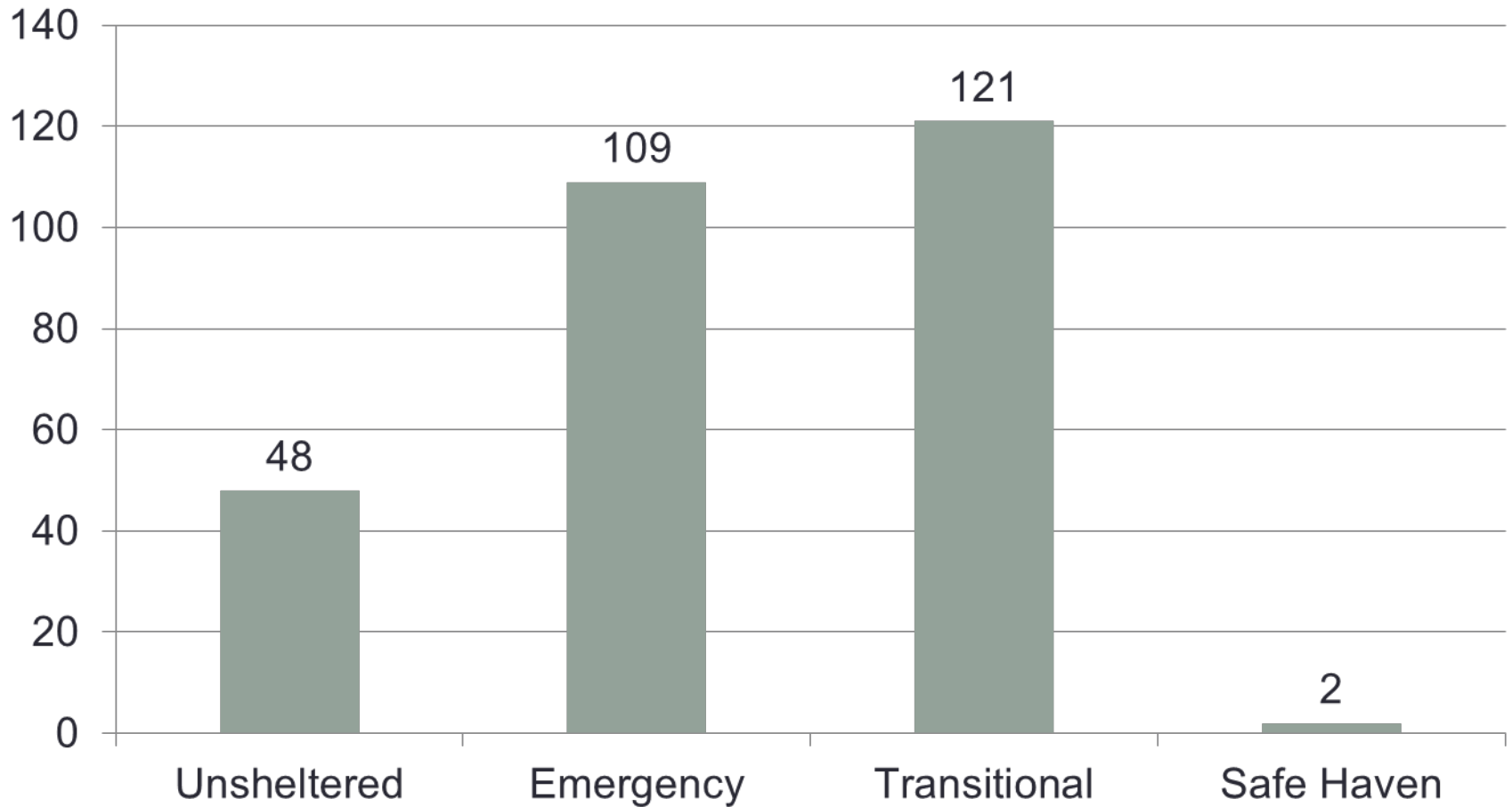

# SOLUTION TO HOMELESSNESS: HOUSING

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- 883 Veterans have been housed since January 2015
- 99 Chronic Homeless Individuals or Households have been housed since January 2015

# Coordinated Entry System

- Access Points throughout Pima County
- Uses Common Assessment Tool (Vulnerability Index – Service Prioritization Decision Assistance Tool (VI-SPDAT))
- TPCH Prioritizes Chronic Homelessness and Veterans
- Matches individual needs with housing openings
- By-Name list of all Veterans experiencing homelessness with VI-SPDAT score
- Tracks monthly housing placement of Veterans
- Tracks monthly inflow of Veterans
