The leadership committee meets regularly to develop & implement strategies to reduce chronic homelessness (CH), veteran homelessness, & time homeless. Performance Management Trackers for CH & veterans distributed. Request PSH agencies take some clients from the top 10 clients to prenavigate them. Veteran population decreased time between voucher & housed, collecting documentation seems to be a hurdle here. Developed a checklist of documents to give to landlords. 2. We have data through May. Hopefully next meeting we will have June. There are concerns about the 2500 actively homeless population spike in Jan 2018. This is because, prior to Jan 2018, we only tracked chronically homeless, & these new numbers represent all populations collectively. However, these numbers also do not match with PIT data, which says there's been a decrease, not an increase.
