Publications Update	Settle	1. There are about 4000+ Need Helps left. We are in good shape & have lots of GOGOs. We will be attempting to have those distributed through parole & probation offices.	
New Business	All	<ol style="list-style-type: none"> <li>1. We want to continue discussion about emergency same-day shelter for families. Pam distributed reports. There's not a lot of information on the people who have been turned away. Using the HIC is an estimation. We have 13 units to serve families fleeing DV &amp; 60 more units throughout the rest of the county, including motel vouchers, which are not always available. Jan-June there was a low number of families identified as homeless thru CE, approximately 34-70. 328 families are waiting for housing right now, some of which may be in shelters, in their cars, on the street, or staying elsewhere.</li> <li>2. Our AHAR data was good enough to go to congress this year. This has been posted to the website. This is an average measurement of 4 nights throughout the year. 90 days is the average length of stay in shelter. This year in particular we have seen more large families. There are people who are being provided motel vouchers through churches &amp; organizations, which is not captured in this report.</li> <li>3. There are some ESG-funded motel units that can be used occasionally. Gospel has some units for mothers &amp; their children up to 13. We've got a majority of the 73 units for families, 21 are motel, 13 are DV, 14 are Gospel's site, 1 Salvation Army, 24 scattered site. We need more family-dedicated shelter.</li> <li>4. Consensus that there needs to be a master list of agencies and organizations that offer emergency shelter, &amp; make it known in the community.</li> <li>5. TPCH will pay for a marketing campaign for Coordinated Entry.</li> </ol>	Settle will email Linda Leatherman to see if she has a list of churches with motel vouchers. If Linda does not have a list, DeDe would be willing to call around to develop one.
